A Message from Father Teodor

BUILDING RESILIENCE: BOUNCING BACK

The definition of resilience reads: "the ability to recover readily from illness, depression, adversity." In other words, it is the ability to bounce back.

Before COVID-19, the word "resilience" was probably only randomly part of our vocabulary, but now that we are well into a second year of a global health pandemic, many of us are asking ourselves how we can stay resilient, develop resiliency, or strengthen our resilience. How can we bounce back?

We're bouncing back from the pandemic with vaccinations and loosening COVID restrictions. Some of us have bounced back from having COVID. Our churches are working hard to bounce back from having to shut down for a period of time. or from losing people or from financial problems.

In 2 Corinthians 6, St. Paul is beseeching the citizens of Corinth to bounce back from their spiritual crisis. He is telling them <u>how</u> they should do it: "as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, ...tumults, labors, ...; by purity, knowledge, forbearance, kindness, genuine love, truthful speech, and the power of God;

He is also telling them when they should do it: "Brethren, working together with him, we entreat you not to accept the grace of God in vain. For he says, "At the acceptable time I have listened to you, and helped you on the day of salvation." Behold, now is the acceptable time; behold, now is the day of salvation.

St. Paul is telling the Corinthians and us that <u>now is the time to bounce back</u> as individual Christians, as families and as the community of Saints Constantine and Helen.

Now it is the time for all of us to consider 'bouncing' back to church. We should dare not neglect our spiritual life. Community prayer, Holy Communion, Bible study, Sunday School classes all play a part in strengthening our faith and our fellowship.

As individuals, we should look within ourselves. What can we do to restore our relationship with God? How can we make time for the health of our soul? It requires intention on our part

As families, we should try to rearrange our priorities. As parents we know that the spiritual growth of our children depends on us. They are looking at us, not just to drive them to church, but also to show in our lives that Christ makes a difference.

As a community, we turn to God in one voice, in prayer. All of us have been disoriented by the environment in which we currently find ourselves. What future we will find ourselves in depends not on the behavior of the virus, but on the actions of people – as individuals, families, communities. But resilience is possible.

May we all "bounce back" strongly.

The St. Cons. Men's Club held their 9th Annual John Koinis Feed the Needy Golf Outing at Fellows Creek Golf Club on Saturday, September 11. Forty golfers enjoyed wonderful weather and a great day of golf to help support the Men's Club Program. Thanks to our 45 sponsors and golfers, the event raised more than \$9,000.

The Men's Club kicked off its Fall fundraising drive for Feed the Needy. Donation envelopes will be available in the Pangari and someone will be collecting contributions at the Coffee Hour after Church on Sundays.

Last year our Men's Club provided Thanksgiving dinners to 118 needy families and 314 individuals in the cities of Westland and Livonia.
